The takeouts

- Any software you use is someone's copyright
- A license details the scope of allowed use
- Any license consists of a set of permissions and conditions
- Knowing standard permissions and conditions enables understanding of the compliance risks
- Keeping track of OSS licenses starts from day one

Copyright and Licensing






Any piece of software is someone's IP

Copyright protects creative works

Software is protected by copyright

- Not the functionality but the expression
- Includes Binary Code and Source Code

The copyright owner only has control over the work that he/she created Infringement may occur if copying without the permission of the author



As a copyright owner you have these (exclusive) rights

- The right to reproduce the software making copies
- The right to create "derivative works" making modifications
- The right to distribute the right to provide copies of a piece of software in binary or source code form
- Moral rights Right to acknowledgement

OSS license in a nutshell




Open Source license

- A "license" is the way a copyright holder to grant a permission to someone else
- A license defines a scope of what you are allowed to do with the software
- A license can have conditions on the grants, meaning you only get the license if you comply with certain obligations
- A license may also include contractual terms regarding warranties, indemnification, support, upgrade, maintenance

- Commercial use
- Distribution
- Modification
- Patent use





OSS license: Conditions


- Disclose source code in binary and/or source code form
- Copyright notice (attribution)
- License notice
- Same license (copyleft)
- State changes
- Notices E.g. No warranty, "as is" notice.




OSS License compliance risks within the software supply chain




When do you need to start with OSS license compliance?
